Every year thousands of children are taken in to Care and need fostering because their parents, for one reason or another are unable to look after them

What is Fostering? Simply.

Fostering is about continuing family life for a child or young person when they can no longer live with their birth family whether it be respite, short-term or long-term care you provide.

It may be that their parents are going through a difficult period, or that the child is abused or neglected. The children and young people can be hurt, frightened and sometimes angry and deserve the support, stability and comfort of a welcoming home. It may also be that the young people are presenting with behaviour which cannot be managed in their own homes.

Fostering is caring for such children and young people. It can mean looking after one or more children or young people for a week, month, year or sometimes even longer until they reach independence at 18. The Foster Carer's role is to nurture, guide and advocate for the children in their care.

As a Foster Carer you are part of a professional network which includes social workers and other professionals such as doctors, health visitors, therapists and schools.

This network is there to help support the young person face the challenges in their lives, but also to help guide you in the role of Foster Carer.


